Vice-Chair Watchman updated the Commission regarding concerns and positions from several members from the Navajo Nation who appeared to speak during the mapping meeting. The Commission again thanked the public for all their comments, and that there were many concerns about the direction the maps were taking, and advised that there is still a long way to go. The Commission stated that the process has been transparent, which was evident with the guests in attendance today.

V. Draft Map decision discussion and possible action concerning revisions to the Grid Map.

After Legislative maps were presented to the Commission with the requested changes, Commissioner Lerner motioned to approve Legislative map 6.1 as a starting point, and Commissioner Mehl seconded the motion. The motion was approved 5-0.

Commissioner York motioned to go into Executive Session to seek legal advice on the procedural issue with the Legislative maps. Vice-Chair Watchman second the motion. The motion was approved 5-0.

Upon returning from Executive Session, Chair Neuberg advised the public that the Commission obtained legal advice regarding a procedural issue with the Legislative map 6.3, and the order in which the maps were approved, they are no longer considering that map version.

Commissioner Lerner motioned to move into Executive Session, and Commissioner Mehl seconded the motion to obtain legal advice on a procedural issue with the Legislative maps.

Upon returning from Executive Session, Chair Neuberg advised the Commission obtained legal advice as it relates to their responsibility to honor the VRA, data provided by Timmons as it relates to district performance, and polarization requirements for minority/majority districts with Legislative maps.

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The mapping team presented the updated Congressional maps to the Commision with the suggested changes.

Commissioner Lerner motioned to go into Executive Session to obtain legal advice with VRA Compliance and polarization with the Congressional maps, and Commissioner Mehl seconded the motion. The motion was approved 5-0.

Upon returning from Executive Session, Chair Neuberg advised the public that the Commission received advice from the legal team about honoring VRA compliance, understanding polarization data for minority communities in regard to the Congressional maps.

The mapping team showed the Commission the suggested changes to the Congressional map. Commissioner York motioned to adopt Congressional map 6.0 as a starting point. Commissioner Mehl seconded the motion, the motion was unanimously approved.

Moving back to the Legislative maps, Commissioner Mehl motioned to adopt Legislative Map 7.0 as a starting point, and Commissioner York seconded the motion. The motion was approved 5-0.

After the mapping team presented the requested changes to the Legislative map, Commissioner Mehl motioned to adopt Legislative map 8.0. Commissioner York seconded the motion. The motion was approved 5-0.
