David Schweikert continues to send out his email newsletter showing he is still representing District #6. His email today October 11th shows him as still Representing District 6. He has election campaign signs all over the area I live in which is NE Phoenix. My understanding from looking at the Congressional redistricted districts shows District #6 is now down in the Tucson area. I've emailed back to the Schweikert election campaign office about this asking for clarification or an explanation of why he continues to show he's representing District #6 and not correct District #1. I've gotten no response from his office or campaign. 10/19/2022 - 12:03	Andy Feldman	Feedback on Draft Report of AZ's Redistricting Data?	<p>Hello AZ IRC,</p> <p>I hope this email finds you well.</p> <p>The RDH is a nonpartisan organization that makes redistricting data available for free so that it is easier for individuals and organizations to participate in the redistricting process, and contribute to fairer representation.</p> <p>We have been working on creating some reports in several states, focused on the quality of redistricting data, including statewide precinct level election results, statewide precinct boundaries, voter file data, and other data.</p> <p>In the past we have had conversations with election administrators and other state officials who expressed surprise that there were more helpful ways or formats to release the data in, and a willingness to make changes. Our hope is that by identifying how states tend to release the data needed for redistricting, compared to how the data could be released to be maximally useful for the public, some state agencies might be willing to implement changes to how they release data for the better.</p> <p>Understanding the election is a busy time, we plan to wait until mid-November to send these reports for reactions and feedback. In the meantime, I was wondering if there is someone who would be willing and able to review and provide feedback, sometime after Election Day, on a draft report on the availability and quality of Arizona's redistricting data? Or are there other individuals you would recommend who might be interested in reviewing a report on the availability and quality of redistricting data?</p> <p>In general, any contact suggestions or insights on how to make such a report on Arizona's redistricting data available to the administrators and officials who would be interested in it are much appreciated.</p> <p>Thank you, Andy Feldman</p>
